- ◆ Read with your child and take part in summer reading programs.
- ◆ Visit the school. Learn what the school is doing for your child and learn how you can take part.
- ◆ Monitor your child's progress through phone calls to the teacher and PowerSchool.
- ◆ Be sure your child dresses appropriately and is dressed in dress code.

Teacher Responsibilities:

- ◆ Provide a cheerful, safe, healthy learning environment.
- ◆ Assign appropriate homework for students abilities.
- ◆ Make sure assignments do not exceed reasonable time limits.
- ◆ Keep parents informed of activities and classroom news.
- ◆ Recognize and respect cultural, racial and ethnic differences and teach students to do the same.
- ◆ Establish a form of communication with parents.
- ◆ Monitor student progress with updates to parents through phone calls and PowerSchool.

Student Responsibilities:

- ◆ Follow school/bus rules.
- ◆ Always be in dress code.
- ◆ Be respectful of adults, students and property.
- ◆ Be prepared/ return assignments on time.
- ◆ Arrive at school on time and ready to learn!
