STAFF: There are approximately 94 teachers, a school psychologist, 2 school social workers, 2 speech-language pathologists, an attendance counselor, a library-media specialist, and a school nurse.

COMMUNITY:

Waterbury has a population of 110,000 and has three public high schools, two parochial schools, one private school, one technical high school, and an inter-district art magnet school in addition to a career academy high school. It is located in northwestern New Haven County.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT: 1,140 students

CURRICULUM: 4 Advanced Placement courses are offered to students. UCONN offers 11 courses through the ECE Program. NVCC awards college credits to high school students who complete courses at the college or high school.

GRADING AND RANKING: The passing grade as of 2007-08 is 65. A Quality Point System is used to determine the student Quality Point Ratio (QPR). It is based on the degree of subject difficulty and the final grades in courses completed. The designation of Highest Honors, First Honors, and Second Honors is determined by the student QPR each marking period.

*Highest Honors 4.0-5.0 QPR *First Honors 3.50-3.99 QPR *Second Honors 3.00-3.49 QPR

Most courses are full year and carry 1 Carnegie Unit (C.U.) 22 C.U. are required for graduation. * 25 C.U.'s are required beginning with the class of 2023.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Several local, state, and national scholarship organizations award funds to students each year.

ACCREDITATION: New England Association of Schools and Colleges, and the Connecticut State Department of Education.

POST HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT: (CLASS OF 2018): 22% attend a 4-year college; 46% attend a 2-year college; 10% attend a vocational or preparatory school; 10% are in the military; 9% work full time; 3% pursued other activities.
