



- ◆ Test takers must take all sub-tests before they will be allowed to re-test for a failed area.
- ◆ There is a 60 day waiting period to retake any failed sub-test.
- ◆ You can only take the test three times per calendar year.

- * Create an account on GED.com.
- * To be eligible to take the GED test, you must take the GED ready practice test and achieve most likely to pass in each subject.
- * Go to Waterbury Adult Education to complete the registration process.

Bring the Following to WAE:

- *Connecticut Driver's License or Non-Drivers ID*
- *Passport with proof of Connecticut Residency*
- *\$13.00 Registration Fee for individuals 21 yrs or older.*
- *17 yrs old: Withdrawal form showing withdrawal date of 6 months.*
- *18 yrs. old: Withdrawal form or letter from school showing the class has graduated.*

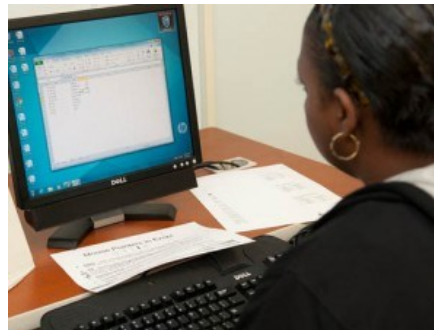
