PAT Certified Parent Educators have been trained to translate scientific information on early brain development into specific *when, what, how* and *why* advice for families. By understanding what to expect during each stage of development, parents can easily capture the teachable moments in everyday life to enhance their child's:

- Language Development
- Intellectual Growth
- Social Development
- Emotional Development
- Fine and Gross Motor Skills

We provide **Free** services such as:

- *Personal Home Visits* during which your parent educator will share age-appropriate child development and parenting information, help you learn to observe your child, and address your parenting concerns.
- *Parent Group Meetings* offer opportunities to share information with others about parenting issues and child development. Parents learn and support each other, observe their children with other children, and practice parenting skills.
- *Screenings* such as The Ages and Stages Questionnaire are used to assess your child's overall development as well as health, hearing, and vision.
- *Resource Network* which links your family to other community services.
